Why you should attend

Professor Bender will examine the most significant decisions in this year's Supreme Court term. Among the topics to be discussed:

- Does the Fourteenth Amendment require a state (1) to license a marriage between two people of the same sex, and (2) to recognize a marriage between two people of the same sex when their marriage was lawfully licensed and performed out of state?
- Does the provision of the Affordable Care Act that provides tax-credit subsidies to persons who purchase health insurance on "an exchange established by a state" exclude subsidies for those who purchase insurance on a federally established exchange?
- Does the three-drug lethal injection protocol constitute "cruel and unusual punishment" if the first drug cannot reliably put the inmate into deep unconsciousness and he may therefore suffer real pain while dying from the other two drugs' effects?
- Does Arizona's use of a commission to adopt congressional districts violate the Elections Clause of the U.S. Constitution?
- Do the major decisions this term indicate that the Supreme Court is politicized?

Paul Bender is a Professor of Law and Dean Emeritus at the Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law at Arizona State University. He has argued more than twenty cases before the Supreme Court.
